Rationale

- 27 million nurses and midwives globally with an additional projected need of 9 million by 2030 (2022, WHO)
- Nurses should be encouraged to assume senior policy and governance roles
- Nurses ae on the front lines of health care and must be empowered to lead



Rationale continued...

- Strong nurse leaders in all settings are needed to address health care challenges and plan for the future
- Nurse leaders should be at the forefront of addressing global health care planning and implementation

 Launched in 2018 at the Frances Payne Bolton School of Nursing, Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio USA.



Samuel H. and Maria Miller Foundation

- A non-profit charitable organization in Cleveland, Ohio.
- The Foundation provided scholarship support to each participant.
- The inaugural nurse executive post-doctoral Fellowship was launched in July 2020.
- Participants were designated Miller Fellows.



Miller Fellows Program

- Marketing, recruitment and selection process.
- 6-credit post-doctoral curriculum.
- Two didactic courses and a practicum.
